RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE "GREEN ACRES, FARMLAND, BLUE ACRES, AND HISTORIC PRESERVATION BOND ACT OF 2007"

WHEREAS, continued investment in open space, farmland and historic preservation is vitally important to the state, as it enhances New Jersey's economy, safeguards its remaining natural, agricultural, recreational and cultural resources and preserves its character; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey continued to face incredible pressure from development, losing over 40 acres of open space daily to new development projects; and

WHEREAS, protecting open spaces and improving community parks throughout the State, including urban areas, supports New Jersey state and local economies by stabilizing local property taxes and revitalizing communities; and

WHEREAS, the Garden State Preservation Trust, the financing authority for the Green Acres, Farmland, and Historic Preservation Program, is virtually depleted despite the continued need for the programs it makes possible; and

WHEREAS, on November 6, 2007, the voters of New Jersey will be asked to approve the Green Acres, Farmland, Blue Acres, and Historic Preservation Bond Act of 2007, which authorizes the state to issue \$200 million in bonds to fund New Jersey's preservation programs for one year and the Blue Acres Program to purchase flood prone properties; and

WHEREAS, passage of the Bond Act is desperately needed to fund the continued protection of New Jersey's natural areas and cultural sites while a long-term funding solution for the Garden State Preservation Trust is determined and secured.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing body of the Borough of Middlesex, in the County of Middlesex and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The Borough of Middlesex encourages the voters of New Jersey to vote yes on the Green Acres, Farmland, Blue Acres, and Historic Preservation Bond Act of 2007 on November 6, 2007.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF MIDDLESEX, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, DESIGNATING AN AREA IN NEED OF REHABILITATION ALONG THE EAST PORTION OF LINCOLN BOULEVARD FROM THE INTERSECTION OF MOUNTAIN AVENUE AND LINCOLN BOULEVARD TO THE EXTENT OF LINCOLN BOULEVARD TO THE EAST IN THE BOROUGH OF MIDDLESEX

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, *N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq.* (the “Redevelopment Law”) authorizes municipalities to determine whether certain parcels of land located therein constitute areas in need of rehabilitation; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Middlesex (the “Borough”) has retained the firm of A. Nelessen Associates, Inc. (the “Planning Consultant”) to prepare a report to determine if the area along the east portion of Lincoln Boulevard from the intersection of Mountain Avenue and Lincoln Boulevard to the extent of Lincoln Boulevard to the East in the Borough (the “Study Area”); and

WHEREAS, the Planning Consultant has determined in a report submitted to the Borough’s Governing Body on September 18, 2007, entitled “East Lincoln Boulevard Area in Need of Rehabilitation Findings Report” (the “September Report”), that more than half the housing stock in the Study Area is at least 50 years old as shown in Figure 1.0 of the September Report, which lists all of the lots with housing in the Study Area and the year that each house was built; and

WHEREAS, such data, which was obtained from the tax assessor’s office in the Borough, shows that 24 or of 33 dwellings in the Study Area, or 73%, are over 50 years of age; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that it will not utilize “Eminent Domain” or grant the power of “Eminent Domain” to any redevelopment entity, and is therefore declaring the Study Area as an area in need of rehabilitation rather than an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the designation of an area in need of rehabilitation will enable the Borough to create a redevelopment Plan (“Redevelopment Plan”), which is a new form-based zoning code applicable to the properties located within the Study Area; and

WHEREAS, a Redevelopment Plan will significantly improve the Study Area and halt the deterioration and several property owners have already expressed interest in rehabilitation based on new design and planning standards that will be developed by the Borough; and

WHEREAS, a program of rehabilitation will clearly not only halt the deterioration but will promote the overall development of the community; and

WHEREAS, the regulations established in the Redevelopment Plan will be based on the results and recommendations from Visual Preference Survey and the Vision Translation Workshop performed as part of the visioning process for the community; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Consultant is already under contract to design a plan for zoning in key focus locations of the proposed area, which will specify new building and streetscape standards designed to improve aesthetics, street life and building types that have more economic potential than existing buildings; and

WHEREAS, the Borough will be permitted to grant property tax exemptions and abatements to landowners who add site or building improvements that comport with the Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Borough now desires to designate the Study Area as an area in need of rehabilitation pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-14.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Middlesex, in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey as follows:

1. The aforementioned recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length.
2. The area along the east portion of Lincoln Boulevard from the intersection of Mountain Avenue and Lincoln Boulevard to the extent of Lincoln Boulevard to the East in the Borough as shown on the map in Figure 2.0 of the September Report, a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, is hereby designated as an area in need of rehabilitation (the “Rehabilitation Area”). All Lots and Blocks in the proposed Rehabilitation Area are listed in Figure 1.0 of the September Report.
3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Mayor D'Angelo opened the public portion of the meeting for comments or questions.

Sherley Penrose questioned the status of the rock for the sign for Daisy Park. Borough Clerk will be sure that this is installed by the October 30, 2007 Girl Scout Anniversary.

Sherley Penrose also mentioned that the Borough will be receiving 4 Colorado Blue Spruce Trees donated in connection with the 90th Anniversary of Girl Scouts and was looking for suggestions of where they could be planted. Mayor D'Angelo felt that Prospect Place may be a good location for these trees, and the Clerk will contact the Army Corp. to see if there is any objection to planting in that area.

Sherley Penrose also requested permission to move at least 3 of the planters that have been vandalized. Mayor D'Angelo stated that this could be discussed over the winter.

Mike McGinley, Douglas Lane, mentioned that he attended the January 23, 2007 Public Meeting and brought to Council the safety concern that he had with commercial vehicles on Giles Avenue. Mayor D'Angelo stated that Councilman Kaplan is working with the Police Department and Code Enforcement and have found that there are conflicting ordinances. Recommendations have been made, and Councilman Kaplan will be bringing them back to Council.

Chet Sadowski, Cedar Avenue stated that the storage facility next to Pathmark is well kept, but the green building across from that property is a mess and has overgrown grass. Mayor D'Angelo stated that he would have the Code Enforcer look into this property.

Mayor D'Angelo mentioned that a DPW garbage truck returning from the landfill was in an accident today and was totaled. The Mayor stated that the DPW normally has four trucks available, three which are used each week and a back up truck. To replace this vehicle there are two options, an emergency capital resolution and an amendment to two prior ordinances from 2002 and 2003. The cost of replacing this vehicle is approximately \$180,000. Mayor D'Angelo recommends amending the two ordinances and going out to bid for the vehicle. This bid cannot be awarded until the funds are available. The ordinance amendment can be introduced at the meeting of October 9, 2007 and adopted at the October 23, 2007 Regular Meeting. We will be purchasing a 2008 vehicle that is outfitted with all the emission controls. The CFO has contact our insurance carrier to see if we can recoup any insurance funds for this vehicle. Council agreed to move forward and amend the two ordinances.

Borough Administrator indicated that Weldon will be back in touch with him with regard to the cement spill on Cedar Avenue.

Seeing that there was no further public participation, Mayor D'Angelo closed the public portion of the meeting.

There being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned by Councilman Venuto and seconded by Councilman DeVuyst and carried by unanimous vote of Council.
